## **RE: Anthrax Follow-Up**

A number of procedures have been established to help those NBC employees who have not yet been screened as a result of last week's anthrax scare.

As a precaution, all employees and visitors who were on the NBC Studio third (3rd) floor between September 18th and September 25, 2001, should be screened and receive treatment. Any NAB ET-CWA-represented NBC employee who falls into the above category, and who has not yet been seen by medical personnel, please do so today between 10AM and 8PM on the mezzanine level at NBC. If you are unable to do so, call the GE/NBC Medical Center on ext. 2322 to make other arrangements.

If you are not identified as needing screening and treatment but still have concerns, call ext. 6868 to schedule an appointment with a medical expert. In addition, the New York City Department of Health has set up an NBC information line at 1-866-692-3641 (outside NYC) or 212-788-4973 (inside NYC).

We will be conducting a meeting with the CDC and NBC's Ed Scanlon late today to discuss all aspects of this anthrax scare, including the Company's failure to notify NABET-CWA and its members in a timely fashion.
